**A REQUEST FROM IMMANUEL LUTHERAN COLLEGE** A recent energy audit and survey of the professorages at ILC has demonstrated the need for work to be done . . . lots of work and a considerable cost. We have already replaced four defective water heaters (CO back draft), which has consumed our IIF for the present. What we need from the brethren are volunteers. We have three roofs that have deteriorated considerably, due to defective shingles (you have seen the TV ad for a law suit). This was not anticipated. If there are experienced shinglers in your congregation, their voluntary labor would considerably reduce the amount of money that we would have to spend. We need volunteers for other projects, also. If your congregation can send a group to ILC, those not experienced with shingling will be provided with other tasks, which fits their skills and abilities. Please let us know if anyone will be available this summer and when. The roofs need to be done this year. If we must, we will contract the work, provided money can be found. The Regents and Trustees are discussing ways to finance all these needs in the aging professorages. May God guide them. God bless you. Prof. John Pfeiffer, President of ILC

(formerly Prof. Schaller's house). This is a 1,988 square foot (1,288 upper/700 lower), split entry, bi-level home built in 1963, with a 2-car attached garage, with 3 BR & 2 BA. It has city water and a private septic system in the Corydon Park subdivision. ### **The Old Testament Reading for Trinity Sunday**

#### **Numbers 6:22-27**

God commanded that Aaron use this threefold blessing on His people. While it doesn't mention the Trinity, it certainly reminds us of the work of the 3 Persons of our God - continued care and protection from the Father, who loves us and calls us His own because of the work of His Son Jesus Christ, and the peace of complete forgiveness which the sinner believes by faith alone through the work of the Spirit in his heart by the Gospel. We read...

### **The New Testament Reading:**

#### **Romans 5:1-5**

We have peace with God the Father through the saving work of Jesus Christ, and God has sent the Holy Spirit in to our hearts so that we believe by faith the main message of the Gospel – Justification by faith! We read...
