Then you shall feed; On her sides shall you be carried, And be dandled on her knees. 13 As one whom his mother comforts, So I will comfort you; And you shall be comforted in Jerusalem." 14 When you see this, your heart shall rejoice, And your bones shall flourish like grass; The hand of the LORD shall be known to His servants, And His indignation to His enemies.

Galatians 6:1-10, 14-16 Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted. 2 Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. 3 For if anyone thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. 4 But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. 5 For each one shall bear his own load. 6 Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches. 7 Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. 8 For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life. 9 And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. 10 Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith. 14 But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. 15 For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but a new creation. 16 And as many as walk according to this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God.

THE SERMON

Luke 10:1-16 After these things the Lord appointed seventy others also, and sent them two by two before His face into every city and place where He Himself was about to go. 2 Then He said to them, "The harvest truly is great, but the laborers are few; therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest. 3 "Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs among wolves. 4 "Carry neither money bag, knapsack, nor sandals; and greet no one along the road. 5 "But whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house.' 6 "And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest on it; if not, it will return to you. 7 "And remain in the same house, eating and drinking such things as they give, for the laborer is worthy of his wages. LETTER FROM PASTOR NOLTING Wednesday, July 07, 2010
Dear Members of Luther Memorial: Six weeks before receiving the call to serve as your pastor, a good friend, whose opinions I value, commented upon hearing that I had been at Immanuel for fourteen years, "It's time for you to leave!" After receiving your call my thoughts naturally returned to his comment and I asked the Lord, "Is it time? Do You want me to leave Mankato and serve in Fond du Lac?" A favorite passage also came to mind: "Delight yourself also in the Lord, and He shall give you the desires of your heart" (Ps. 37:4). Many years ago when Sara was teaching in your school and I spent many weekends in your midst, I asked the Lord, if it were ever His will, to give me the opportunity to serve at Luther Memorial some day. That opportunity has now presented itself a second time. With those thoughts and that opportunity in mind Sara and I were willing—you might even say eager to make the move and begin a new phase of service within God's kingdom. However, the question of the Lord's will remained—where did the Lord want me to serve? I asked the Lord to make His will clear to me. In the last three weeks some rather extraordinary things have happened here in Mankato: five families have asked me to provide them with instructions in preparation for membership; a non-member resident and the management of a nine-story apartment building in downtown Mankato have asked me to begin a Bible Study there especially in view of its large number of disabled residents; a non-member resident of a nursing home was placed under my spiritual care; and the attendance at my Sudanese Bible Study increased from six to eight. Dear members of Luther Memorial—I asked the Lord to make it clear to me whether it was time to leave Mankato and to serve in Fond du Lac. All of these opportunities would suggest to me that it is clearly the will of the Lord that I remain here at Immanuel at this time. Therefore, I must inform you that I feel compelled to return your call to serve as your pastor. Even as I am now confident of the Lord's present will for me, I am also confident that the Lord of the Church will provide you with the called servant of His choosing—someone to replace Pastor Naumann, the faithful servant to whom you will bid farewell next Sunday. It is my prayer that our Lord will provide you with that servant in the very near future. I wish to thank Don and Rhoda Eserhut, Michael Sippert, David Bernthal, and Pastor

Naumann for their willingness to share their time and counsel with me during the recent convention. I would also like to thank your chairman, Jim Fillmore, for his time and counsel both on the telephone and via e-mail. They were all most gracious.
