THE ORDER OF SERVICE

I. WE PREPARE TO MEET OUR LORD

THE INVOCATION

We invoke ("call upon") the name of our Triune God.

Leader: We begin our worship service today in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit!

ALL: I thank you, my Heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen!

OPENING HYMN: #1 (1-2, 5) [Red Hymnal]

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION OF SINS

We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.

P: God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.

ALL: If we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.

P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

ALL: Almighty God, merciful Father, we are sinful by nature, and have sinned against You in our thoughts, words, and actions. But we are sorry for our transgressions and pray You, of Your bountiful mercy, to be gracious and merciful unto us. Forgive us for Jesus' sake, renew us by Your Spirit, and lead us in the way everlasting.

P: Jesus Christ is the satisfactory payment for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world. You are forgiven. With boldness and confidence we may approach the throne to find grace to help in time of need. In the peace of Jesus Christ's forgiveness, let us praise the Lord!

ALL: Amen!

PRAYER OF THE DAY

P: Let us pray . . . through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Congregation (speaks): Amen.

II. OUR LORD SPEAKS TO US

1ST SCRIPTURE LESSON ~ ISAIAH 1:10-18

The Children of Israel are chastised by the LORD's forceful words through the prophet Isaiah. So much so, that they are compared to the godless people of Sodom and Gomorrah. The LORD didn't even accept their worship anymore because it had become so corrupted. He couldn't stand to look at them, like Luther once illustrated, in their "despising of the kernel and admiring the husk." And yet, the LORD invites them to look at His mercy and faithfulness and see what He would do for them and their sin.

10 Hear the word of the LORD, You rulers of Sodom; Give ear to the law of our God, You people of Gomorrah: **11** "To what purpose is the multitude of your sacrifices to Me?" Says the LORD. "I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams And the fat of fed cattle. I do not delight in the blood of bulls, Or of lambs or goats. **12** "When you come to appear before Me, Who has required this from your hand, To trample My courts? **13** Bring no more futile sacrifices; Incense is an abomination to Me. The New Moons, the Sabbaths, and the calling of assemblies -- I cannot endure iniquity and the sacred meeting. **14** Your New Moons and your appointed feasts My soul hates; They are a trouble to Me, I am weary of bearing them. **15** When you spread out your hands, I will hide My eyes from you; Even though you make many prayers, I will not hear. Your hands are full of blood. **16** "Wash yourselves, make yourselves clean; Put away the evil of your doings from before My eyes. Cease to do evil, **17** Learn to do good; Seek justice, Rebuke the oppressor; Defend the fatherless, Plead for the widow. **18** " Come now, and let us reason together," Says the LORD, "Though your sins are like scarlet, They shall be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They shall be as wool.

2ND SCRIPTURE LESSON ~ HEBREWS 3:1-6

"Apostle" means "one who is sent." Jesus is The Apostle in that he was sent by God the Father to build the Holy Christian Church. As the high priest of our confession, Jesus sacrificed Himself for the sake of all people. Moses was a faithful servant in the house of God, but Jesus is better! He is faithful as God's Son. He created God's house. As the builder, Jesus deserves all glory because of His faithfulness to God. Let us hold fast to this hope with confidence!

1 Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus, **2** who was faithful to Him who appointed Him, as Moses also was faithful in all His house. **3** For this One has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as He who built the

house has more honor than the house. **4** For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things is God. **5** And Moses indeed was faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which would be spoken afterward, **6** but Christ as a Son over His own house, whose house we are if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end.

OUR CONFESSION OF FAITH ~ THE 2ND ARTICLE (REDEMPTION)

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead...

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

This is most certainly true.





Notes:

- * **General Fund** offerings in February totaled \$56,951 vs disbursements of \$66,851, a shortfall resulting in a balance of \$16,961. Budgetary offerings needed per month are \$77,500.
- * **ILC Building Projects** revenue in February totaled \$2,015 vs the monthly mortgage payment of \$8,000. The Board of Trustees maintains a 3-month payment reserve in this fund and so will pay down \$80,000 of the \$106,000 balance directly on the loan principal, saving total interest of \$115,000 & decreasing the loan term by 2 years.
- * **CEF:** revenue in February totaled \$87,309 from CEF loan repayments & a new note received vs disbursements of \$103,725 due to several promissory notes matured and paid.
- * **MDF:** offerings in February totaled \$16,834 vs disbursements of \$2,814.
- * **SAF:** received \$13,402 in February from congregational offerings (\$1,600), memorials (\$2,500), and student loan re-payments (\$8,800) vs disbursements of \$12,879 for allocation of 2nd semester student grants (\$2,900), monthly student loans (\$9,000), and admin expenses (\$1,100).
- * **IIF:** The ILC Improvement Fund February offering was \$2,330, which brings the IIF balance to \$194,873. This will enable us to do all the approved projects in the IIF, including re-paving of Ingram Drive, field house heating upgrade, and several professorage repairs & upgrades.

Looking Forward to Next Sunday!

“Looking forward to Next Sunday” Family Devotions - As we look ahead to Palm Sunday, we look forward to bowing before Christ our Savior’s triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Our King, Jesus the Christ, comes to us in a lowly and humble way (Zechariah 9:9), and yet when He comes again it will be in His awesome power and glory to lead us to our eternal home! Jesus lead Thou on, till our Rest is won!

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 45:22-25 There is only one true God in whose name we will be saved. This one true God calls His children to repentance. He makes an oath that will not be revoked. His Word will not return to Him void but accomplish His will. (Isaiah 55:11) His Word is so certain that in the final Day of Judgment, every knee will bow and every tongue will declare Jesus is the LORD! (Philippians 2:10) On that Day, will you kneel in fear of Christ, or kneel in joy lifting up your head? The prophet Isaiah reminds us to get ready! (TLH 114; WS 763, 744)

Gospel Reading: Mark 11:1-10 This is the account of Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. How “triumphant” was this scene? Jesus is riding in on a colt, a little baby donkey, with visibly no power or glory. Yet, the shouts of “Hosanna” toward Jesus echo through the streets for their deliverance and salvation. What kind of salvation were they looking for? It seems clear the Jews were looking for an earthly savior as their shouts turned that week to “Crucify Him”! Are we that fickle with our knowledge of Christ and what we need Him for? Jesus came not to be the king that we WANT Him to be, but that we NEED Him to be! (WS 725; TLH 160-162)

Psalms 145:1-12 David declares in this song that the LORD is His King and worthy of blessing, honor, and praise. His works will be praised from one generation to the next because of His gracious and tender mercy. How will you, in this generation, follow and praise Him? (TLH 575)

Epistle Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:11-18 The Apostle Paul is talking about how the Corinthians persecution is strengthening other believers. On Palm Sunday, Jesus is going to be put to death to work life in us. The same thing was happening with the suffering of the apostles in Corinth. Through their example of standing up for the truth, others were encouraged and the gospel was spread. We can be encouraged because we speak of what we know - as Christ is raised, we too will be raised. We need not lose heart as we suffer through the trials and tribulations in this world because we know that these sufferings will give way to the glory of eternal life with our Savior. Afflictions and struggles are temporary. Therefore, they are light compared to the glory that is to come. The momentary struggles can’t be compared to the eternal glory that awaits us. (TLH 394)
